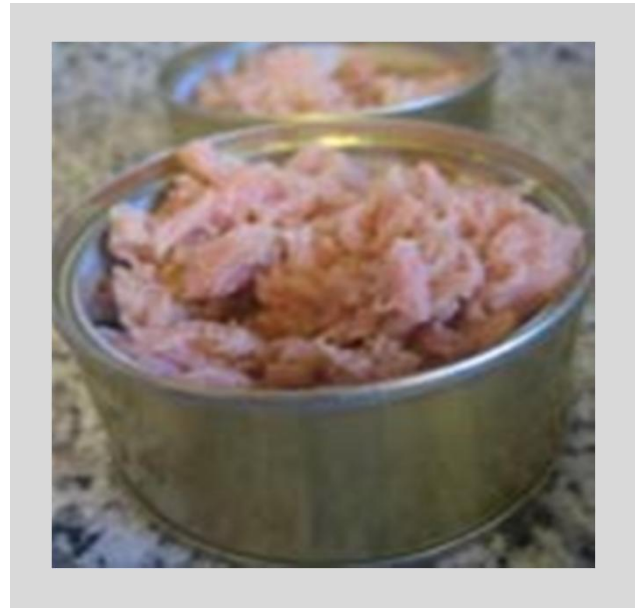


*Highlights***Canned tuna business rising**

In 2010, exports of canned tuna (including skipjack tunas and mackerel), grew 65.1% to \$ 10 million, and 42.7% advanced volume up to 2.5 thousand MT. Main exports are represented by the increased demand from Colombia (295.7% to grow. With respect to the volume exported in 2010, Italy (242.3% to grow.) And Spain (3.9%), these two places together sum up 92.9% of the Peruvian tuna supply, exports to the United Kingdom began again which contributed partly to boosting exports. In 2010, tuna exports accounted for 81.7% of the total tuna exports, skipjack and mackerel (bonito), with the remainder to the latter two species.



In 2010 the major exporting companies were: Seafrost (63.4% in export volumes in 2010), Austral Group (30.8% of part.), Seven Stars Corporation (4.2%) and Food Technology (0.8%). The increased availability of resources is affecting the increase in export supply, thanks to favorable oceanographic conditions for tuna. Thus, under the Ministry of Production between January and October 2010 the extraction of tuna for canning category rose 271.2% to 7015 MT. Should current oceanographic conditions continue, the forecast will be a good scenario for the tuna industry, due to greater demand abroad and the domestic market
